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PARTICIPATION NUMBERS


The seminar had **1.858** registered people from different places all over the world. 90% were from countries in Latin America and the Caribbean, while the other 10% were from Europe.

The participants were people with different jobs and knowledge areas from the book and reading ecosystem, such as actors, teachers, librarians, editors, publishers, designers, illustrators, health workers, psychologists, parents, among others.

81,5% of the people registered expressed that they participated in the whole seminar.



CLOSING WORDS - CONCLUSIONS

Crisia Málaga (president IBBY Peru)

We want to appreciate the organizing team of this important event, Constanza Mekis, Elisa Villanueva y Luz Yennifer Reyes, who also had the support from Abigail Truchsess y Magdalena Contreras in the important broadcast of the event in social media.

To the Chilean illustrator Paula Álvarez, creator of the image of SELAC 2021, who gave us a colour and aesthetic party for our new image, and Sur production and all their experts team for the invaluable support in the development of the activities.

The SELAC projects to be an exchange space to strengthen the bond among the countries in the region, looking for those common points and that Latin American and Caribbean spirit that makes us so unique with the word.

We gave visibility and potential to the richness and diversity of Latin America and the Caribbean, through the rescue of the orality and other literary and cultural expressions special to each country, region, or locality from early childhood.

The happening of the SELAC has also been a very valuable space to create instances of training and exchange, directed to reading mediators with universal, free, and virtual access, enriched by the cultural exchange among regions, local cultures, indigenous peoples, civil society institutions and regional governments. We wanted to show the academic, reflexive and practical work of experts, mediators, academics, who are part of the book and reading ecosystem in Latin America and the Caribbean, in a space of exchange and reflection.

Thus, in the **conversation: To narrate, To tell and To sing**, we have been able to listen to the songs and tales of a great number of artists, narrators and mediators, and we were able to appreciate the rhythms, sounds, and melodies of different places of the region.

In the **Round table: Publising for Early Childhood**, we had a publishers, authors, and illustrators panel, that showed us new tendencies in the publishing sector directed especially for Early Childhood.

Initiatives that want to surprise the reader, with new visions of the child, recognizing that there is no ideal reader, where childhoods are recognized as

complex readers, with different interests, questions, needs, and likes.

Thus, we can see that catalogues are appearing, that are conveyed as live creatures that transform themselves. Themes that integrate humor, social topics, and that look for the inclusion of diverse population.

It is evident, as well, an impulse to the recovery of the oral voices, books that look for the patrimonial rescue, and that hope to portray the traditions and cultural manifestations of each region.

Hybrid between discursive genres, where the folklore, poetry, songs, verses, rhymes, and informative books are mixed.

A want for different formats, where we were able to see books written in Braille, album books, silent books, pop up books that work as a refuge for children in moments of uncertainty and change.

During the day we were delighted with different **Samples around the fire,** here we were able to listen to tongue twisters, rowdies, songs, stories, romances, among others, that show the tradition of the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean, and the role orality has in the early stages of the children, when their mind is developing.

Orality is one of the main means necessary for the sensory bond between the child and the mother or primal carer to be activated, in a play of sounds, words, melodies, that give the ability to symbolize, and slowly, to name the world and make sense and meaning of it.

The Conference: Policies, Programs and Actions for the training of young readers in Latin America and the Caribbean (CERLALC), showed us the framework that include the policies for the training of young readers.

- Convention on the Rights of the Child, the child as a subject of rights. Right to participate in democratic life of their respective countries.
- Agenda 2030
- World strategies for women's health

In this moments of crisis, we have seen that children, being the ones less at risk of contracting COVID 19, have been forbidden to go to their centres and use their services, compromising their learnings, their food safety, exposing them to unstimulated environments, to situations of potential violence.

The digital breach affects 32 million children, who can not access virtual education in Latin America.

There is a change in the focus of policies, that not only want to guarantee the access, but also ensure the quality of the services. In the same way, they want

to give an integrated attention to children, creating multisectoral strategies that relate the public, private, school, associations environments and many more. It is generalized now the vision of the child as a creator, through diverse languages, being them written or oral. These must be present in the attention competent.

To bring together literature and art from the beginning impact at all levels, including health.

There are some advances in the laws of early childhood, such as in El Salvador, Paraguay, Peru. Some state policies are being consolidated with guaranteed resources for the attention of the youngest. Some advances are proven in the National Reading Plans and National Strategies, that contemplate important actions focused on Early Childhood, with services for children from 0 to 7 years old.

- New pleasurable approximations to reading and literature are born, relating them with other disciplines such as art, drama, music, tradition, and local and regional culture.
- New multimedia resources are appreciated, that have been born because of the pandemic, that allow to reinforce learning and to generate stimulant environments for children.
- Also, the strengthening of public libraries, with heritage endowments and quality materials.
- The creation of new tools to train mediators and teachers.
- Actions to help the families to reinforce their reading habits, that want to reach more vulnerable zones and spaces, such as houses, prisons, hospitals, in Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Peru, Portugal and other countries of the region.

We should move forward to a participation approach, guaranteeing that children can participate in the cultural, social, and economic life of their countries as citizens with rights.

On the other side, the Carrousel of mediating experiences: Early childhood in Latin America and the Caribbean, gave us a new perspective to questions like: how to keep accompanying children if their educational centres are still closed and they can't receive their students? How can we still create knowledge? And, how can we keep fomenting reading under these conditions?

This has given place to new mediation strategies, learning communities, construction spaces based on the exchange of ideas. In the different cases presented, the image of the child and their abilities were rethought, as well as our role as parents, teachers and MEDIATORS.

We can highlight the presence of the book, but also the voice, the baggage of orality as a resource to reconnect with the child.

Finally, in the keynote conference done by the Argentinian expert María Emilia López "Adventures and misadventures of the relationship between poetic orality and breeding", the importance of the voice of the mother or primal carer in the first stages of life is highlighted, through lullabies, poems, verses, which are the first dialogues that they have with the babies. To appeal to the community, the work with schools, and families as creators of reading and learning. Methodological proposals more and more elaborated, with the participation of different community actors, together with political, governmental, and private agents, and the actors of the book chain. All these ambits must come together to generate proposals and synergies that reach the children and reach to them effectively.

The importance of proposing different reading experiences is highlighted, and the recognition that there is no one way of reading.

A proposition for reading, to make it: reflexive, critical, active, ludic, that strengthens a symbolic construction, that doesn't domesticate us, but allows us to change the world.

We hope that the SELAC generated points of contact, exchange of experiences, allowing for new alliances and synergies. An instance that allows to contribute also to reduce inequalities in the countries of our region, guaranteeing a quality and inclusive and equitable education, and to promote new opportunities of permanent learning for everyone who is a part of our community.
