Promoting Creativity and Cultural Heritage

- Creative Writing Competition: With 74 submissions from children aged 6-18, this initiative spotlighted young talent and gave winners the chance to be published online.

LBBY: A YEAR OF LITERACY AND IMPACT IN LEBANON

TRANSFORMING PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES AND RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS

In partnership with UNESCO, Book Aid International, and SPAZI, LBBY led renovations in public school libraries and donated books to mosques and churches. These efforts have created inclusive and engaging spaces for children and communities, ensuring that books remain a cornerstone of learning and connection.





A Library for Refugees: Tahaddi Education Center

LBBY, supported by the Yamada Fund, Book Aid International, and SPAZI, established a library at the Tahaddi Education Center to provide refugee children with access to books and a safe space for learning and creativity.

PROMOTING READING FOR DISPLACED CHILDREN IN BEKAA

With funding from UNICEF, the Crisis Fund IBBY, Book Aid International, and SPAZI, LBBY launched reading programs for displaced children in Bekaa. Storytelling sessions, creative activities, and bibliotherapy helped support their emotional and cognitive well-being.

BRINGING CHILDREN AND BOOKS CLOSER TOGETHER IN TIMES OF CRISIS

In response to the outbreak of war, LBBY collaborated with **Book Aid International and the IBBY Crisis Fund to support** children displaced by the conflict. Mobile libraries and literacy activities were complemented by kits containing art supplies and books, distributed to volunteers working with displaced children in schools. LBBY also trained volunteers on best practices for engaging with and supporting children affected by trauma, fostering hope, resilience, and emotional healing during these challenging times.
